

Victory Academy Student Artwork

The Victory Academy program is a partnership between Ada County Juvenile Court Services, the Boise School District, and the Idaho Youth Ranch, to provide educational opportunities to students who are involved with the Juvenile Court system, living at the Hays shelter, &/or are suspended or expelled from school.

The mission of the academy is to help these students earn credits toward a high school diploma or GED.

Students involved in the Victory Academy program are engaged to participate in a variety of projects, including those designed to nurture creativity and enhance their involvement in the community, such as creating expressive artwork.

Student artwork has been displayed at local art galleries and the Boise Art Museum, and is now on display at the Ada County Courthouse (3rd & 4th floors). A few samples of this beautiful artwork are shown on the following pages, and will be on display for viewing at the Courthouse as part of the “Smart Justice” themed National County Government Month in April 2013.
