

# Waiting List Lottery Opening

 **May 28–June 27, 2024**

 **Housing Choice Voucher Program**

The Boise City / Ada County Housing Authorities (BCACHA) will be accepting pre-applications for potential placement on the Housing Choice Voucher Program waiting list on May 28, 2024.

## What is The Housing Choice Voucher Program?

The Housing Choice Voucher (also known as Section 8) is a subsidized housing program ran by local housing authorities and funded by the US. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The program is designed to help eligible households rent safe and affordable housing by paying some or all of their rental costs.

## Do I Qualify?

Due to limited funding availability, the BCACHA will only be opening the waiting list lottery to pre-applicants that meet all of the following qualifications:

- 1** Head of Household must be over 18 years of age; AND
- 2** The household must qualify as low-income; AND
- 3** The household must qualify for the Idaho residency preference (a family qualifies if the family lives, works, or has been hired to work within the state of Idaho); AND
- 4** Must meet at least one of the following definitions:
  - Head of household, co-head or spouse are age 62 or older; or
  - Head of household, co-head or spouse is disabled; or
  - Families with children under the age of 18



## How Do I Apply?

Submit a pre-application online at [www.bcacha.org](http://www.bcacha.org) between May 28 and June 27, 2024. Eligible application will be entered into a lottery where only 2,500 households will be randomly selected and placed on the waiting list.
