CHECKING OUT THE TURF CLUB

Several interested parties toured the Turf Club at EXPO Idaho in April as part of the county's Request for Information (RFI) process. The county is interested exploring different options for using the now empty space. The Turf Club was previously used as a facility for horse racing betting and simulcasting. In 2018 Idaho voters rejected a measure that would have allowed horse racing and betting to continue at EXPO Idaho. The Turf Club, which is currently unoccupied, is two levels with a total of 12,495 square feet of usable space and a paved parking lot in front of the facility.













The next step involves receiving submittals from the interested parties. Those submittals would then be reviewed by the Board of Commissioners who are interested in hearing about how to get the best and highest use from this Ada County asset.

The Turf Club is located on Ada County's 240-acre EXPO Idaho property at the corner of Glenwood Street and Chinden Boulevard. The property sits right along the Boise River with sweeping views of the foothills.







EARTH DAY FACTOIDS! DID YOU KNOW.....

THE ORANGE BAG PROGRAM

► Ada County is one of only four communities in the nation chosen to participate in the program

► The Energy Bags are used to collect and recycle household plastics that aren't accepted in the curbside recycling program

► It provides a solution for hard-to-recycle plastics not allowed in the regular recycling program such as grocery bags, plastic wrap, and Styrofoam packing material


► A commercial version is being piloted at the Ada County Courthouse since March of 2021

► Over 1500 tons of plastic waste has been directed from landfills nationwide since the program began

ABOUT OUR LANDFILL

Approximately 663 tons of material from County-owned buildings was recycled instead of ending up in landfill

One of the largest recycling programs in Idaho is run by the Ada County Landfill: the county's wood waste recycling program, reclaiming around 150,000 cubic yards of waste each year.

▶ Public recycling programs and diversion programs are available on site to extend the life of the landfill and protect the environment including:

- > E-Waste Recycling Center for televisions, printers, microwaves, and other electronic items
 > Household Hazardous Waste Facility for items that are flammable, corrosive, or toxic such as batteries, paint, pesticides, etc.
- > Wood & Christmas Trees
- > Motor Oil & Tires
- > Metals & Refrigeration


