CONGRATULATIONS TO ADA COUNTY JUVENILE SERVICES!

The Bridge Youth and Family Resource Center is officially open!

The warm and inviting resource center in Boise will help young people stay out of the juvenile justice system and instead redirect them to other resources that yield profoundly better results. Gone are the days of Scared Straight when children who were having difficulties navigating adolescence, and who may have had challenging home lives or other issues, were introduced to prison life. It was a way of scaring them into avoiding a life of incarceration.

Years of research now shows us that redirecting children to supportive services is the better way. It's better for the children, it's better for their families and it's better for our communities. The program has the enthusiastic support of the law enforcement community as well.

We thank Governor Little for his support and for the funding he championed in the legislature that's now being administered by the Idaho Department of Juvenile Corrections. This is a fiscally responsible approach because keeping people out of the criminal just system is the best use of our time and our money.



Congratulations also to the young people who are doing the hard work and finding new ways to adapt and to focus on creating productive and meaningful futures.



ADA COUNTY COMMISSIONERS TOUR NEW TERRY REILLY CLINIC


Ada County's FY24 Budget included \$227,000 for Terry Reilly

A new Terry Reilly Health Services clinic centrally located at 3115 E. Florence Street just off Eagle Rd. opened in May. The Ada County Commissioners were grateful to have been given a tour of the impressive facility in August. Ada County Commissioner Ryan Davidson, Chairman Rod Beck and Commissioner Dayley were shown around the facility that includes state of the art medical and dental facilities.

If you are not familiar with Terry Reilly health services it's a community treasure worth learning about. Terry Reilly's mission is to provide affordable, accessible, comprehensive care for the community. Terry Reilly accepts all insurance and uses a sliding fee scale for individuals and families who are underinsured or uninsured. Another piece of great news is that the Meridian Clinic was awarded more than \$589, 000 in ARPA funds to be used for internal remodeling and equipment at the Meridian Clinic.

WEST NILE VIRUS PREVALENT IN ADA COUNTY

As summer draws to a close it's important to remember that West Nile Virus (WNV) is still a threat.



The species of mosquitoes that can transmit WNV in Ada County are active from dusk to dawn. If you spend any time outdoors in the evening, Ada County Mosquito Abatement encourages you to wear long-sleeved light-colored clothing and an EPA-approved mosquito repellant (with an active ingredient of DEET, Picardin, or Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus). You can also help to protect you and your family from WNV by looking for any sources of standing water on your property. Mosquitoes can breed in an amount of water as small as a bottle cap, be sure to look for any clogged drains, tires, toys, etc. that could gather water. Also, be careful to not overwater your lawn or garden, as these are prime examples of habitat for the WNV vector species in Ada County.
