Civil Mediations - Process

- Presiding Judge orders the case to judicial mediation and, clerk issues Mediation Order (Odyssey form).
- The parties must select a mediator, or 2 preferred mediators, within 28 days of the order, and if one is not chosen, the court will select a mediator from the Civil Case Mediator roster.
 - If an Active or Senior judge is selected, the information below will be provided to TCA (Imelda Ramirez, Deputy TCA, iramirez@adacounty.id.gov) by counsel to confirm judge availability.
