Commitment to Sustainable Design

Built on a brownfield to reduce urban spraw, the Ada County Courthouse and Administration Building now serves as an anchor on the east end of the River/Myrtle District and promotes a thriving urban center. Ada County Commissioners have passed a resolution that all buildings will be constructed to LEED standards. Any future development projects at this site will salvage 75% of demolition waste, use 10% salvaged or refurbished materials, and use 50% of materials manufactured within a 500 mile radius.



Access to public transportation is convenient with two bus routes located within a ¼ mile. Ada County provides subsidies to employees who use alternative transportation. Renewable Energy Naturally hot geothermal water provides 19% of total energy requirement for the building.
