PROJECT OVERVIEW

The project consists of a new administration and training facility for the Ada County Paramedics (ACP) to better serve residents in Ada County. The facility was specifically designed and tailored to support ACP's mission to provide an innovative, effective, and efficient Emergency Medical Services System to safeguard and enhance the health and quality of life of those we serve.

The ACP provide advanced life support services around the clock to over 361,500 residents of Boise, Meridian, Garden City, Eagle, Star, Kuna, and rural Ada County through an emergency medical service dispatched by the county's 9-1-1 communications center, just like area law enforcement.

The new facility will be LEED Certified by the US Green Building Council. LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) is a national rating system used to develop high-performance, sustainable buildings. LEED emphasizes state-of-the-art strategies for site development, water savings, energy efficiency, materials selection, and indoor environmental quality.



ENVIRONMENTAL BENEFITS

- Storage and collection of recyclables
- Low emitting materials, no VOC's
- Linoleum flooring and recycled-content carpet tiles
- Low-water use fixtures and landscaping
- Natural daylight and views for the occupants
- Energy-efficient lighting / HVAC system, 36% better than code
