## FACILITIES AND SERVICES

The Ada County Commissioners, based upon the Governor's 4-Stage Guidelines, will determine when to change stages (forward or backward) based upon data and science, including information about the spread of the virus, healthcare capacity, and our public health system's ability to test and isolate rapidly. The facility and service openings outlined here are tentative and could change based upon additional data.

## RETURN TO STAGE 3 Partial Reopening June 24

- Continue to restore county services consistent with the Governor's 4-Stage Guidelines.
- County staff returns to work as necessary with a combination of shift rotations and working from home.
- Driver's License resumes normal operations for walk-in and appointments. No more than 50 people at a time will be permitted into the building.
- Clerk continues to operate the customer service trailer in the parking lot of the courthouse to transact limited county business, answer questions from the public and facilitate entrance to the courthouse.
- Courthouse opens to the public June 1, 2020 with access limited to a reduced number to promote social distancing and with enhanced cleaning practices. Face coverings are required for all who enter the courthouse.
- Treasurer's Office opens for business inside the courthouse and at the Cloverdale facility.
- Clerk's Office opens for business inside the courthouse.
- Development Services will resume operations.
- Expo Idaho continues operating remote court access venue for the public to attend court hearings virtually.
- Ada County Procurement will be open with limited staff until Stage 4.
- Public Defender's Office opens for meetings with clients by appointment only.
